TOEFL iBT Testing Options

The TOEFL iBT test is offered three different ways, so you can choose the best option to fit your needs and preferences.

Test at a test center

If you prefer a traditional test environment, a test center is the best option for you.

- Availability: Available worldwide at thousands of authorized TOEFL iBT test centers.
- Test day: Visit What to Expect on Test Day to see a video about checking in and other test center procedures you'll
 experience on test day.
- Dates: Offered more than 60 times a year.

Find a Test Center

Test at home

The TOEFL iBT Home Edition is the same TOEFL iBT test you would take at a test center, just taken from the privacy of your own home and monitored online by a human proctor. It's trusted and accepted by universities worldwide.

- Availability: Available worldwide.
- Requirements: Make sure you meet the <u>Environment and Equipment requirements</u> for at home testing **before** you register.
- Test day: Learn what to expect on test day.
- Dates: Available 24 hours a day, 4 days a week, with appointments available as early as 24 hours after you register.

Schedule Your Test

Test on paper

The Paper Edition measures the same four skills, but you'll take it in two sessions. Learn more about <u>the test content for the Paper Edition</u>.

- Test sessions:
 - Reading, Listening, and Writing sections: **on paper at a test center**.
 - Speaking section: at home on your computer within 3 days after the paper sections. Your Speaking session will be monitored online by a human proctor.
- Availability: Available in Colombia. India. Mexico and the United States. More countries will be added in the future.
- Requirements: Make sure you meet the <u>Environment and Equipment requirements</u> for at home testing **before** you register.
- Test day: Review On Test Day information for both at home testing and test center testing.
- Dates: Offered one to two times a month. When you to register, you'll make two appointments: one at your local test center and the other at home.



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



Troubleshooting tips

If you receive an error message after submitting a practice question response, make sure:

- $\bullet \ \ \text{additional tabs containing practice items are closed; only one practice question can be open at a time}\\$
- you haven't submitted any special characters (i.e., \$&^#), nonsense or completely off-topic responses
- your responses aren't exceptionally short or exceptionally long; a good response should be around 100 words

If you're still receiving an error message after the troubleshooting tips have been applied, this could be due to technical issues, including slow load times or an unusually high volume of users. If this occurs, please try again later.

Scoring for Writing for an Academic Discussion practice questions

After submitting a response to a practice question, an immediate Al-generated score will be displayed. This score is unofficial and serves as an approximate score test takers might receive. On the real TOEFL iBT test, all answers are reviewed by AI and humans for the highest level of accuracy.

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



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ID Requirements and Test Procedures



Before you register, be sure to view the <u>ID requirements</u> and the <u>TOEFL iBT® Information</u> <u>Bulletin (PDF)</u> for complete instructions for registration, forms, score reporting information, policies and procedures.

Before your test session begins

Prepare your testing area

- Close all applications and any unnecessary browser windows or tabs on your computer. This can help prevent bandwidth issues while you test.
- Stop, close or shut down any other devices in your household that may use significant internet bandwidth
 while you're testing.
- Gather the materials you'll need for your test session. These are the only materials permitted:
 - o Passport or other acceptable identification. See ID requirements.
 - Acceptable note-taking materials, such as a whiteboard or plastic transparency sheet, that can be erased in view of the proctor
 - Cell phone or handheld mirror for check in (after check in, you should put these away somewhere inaccessible)
- Make sure your testing area meets all <u>environment requirements</u>.
- Make sure you are dressed appropriately, with your ears and face visible to the proctor. Avoid wearing any
 jewelry or other accessories. Face masks are prohibited during check in or any part of your at home testing
 experience.

Checking in

The check-in process takes about 20 minutes.

- At your appointment time, click the link to start your test in the confirmation email you received after
 registering, or in your ETS account. You'll have 15 minutes after your scheduled start time to begin your
 check in or your test will be canceled and you won't be refunded.
- Select "Start Session."
- Show your identification to the test proctor. The name on your identification must match the name that you used when you registered for the test.
- The proctor will request access to your computer screen and ask you to:
 - o show your computer screen using a handheld mirror or cell phone.
 - move the camera on your computer to show a 360-degree view of the room, including your tabletop surface and the space below, and any other places in the room the proctor may wish to inspect.
- Immediately before beginning your test, you'll walk through one more Equipment Check with the proctor, who
 will attempt to assist in troubleshooting any issues.

During your test

To ensure your test day goes well, follow the procedures listed in the *Bulletin*, including the important rules below. If you don't follow these rules, your test scores can be canceled, and your registration fee will not be refunded.

- Don't communicate with anyone other than the proctor.
- Don't use any unauthorized materials, including personal recording devices, mobile devices, smartwatches, prewritten notes or textbooks at any time during the test.
- Certain behaviors will invalidate your test and can result in score cancelation. Avoid the following behaviors:
 - o Talking out loud to yourself
 - o Looking away from the screen
 - $\circ~$ Moving out of view of the camera
 - Taking a break
- Disable any screen-sharing or remote-access software (such as Zoom®, Skype®, TeamViewer®, Microsoft Teams®, Anydesk® and Apple Remote Desktop™) prior to the test. These must remain disabled throughout

the test. Make absolutely sure that the software won't open automatically during the test.

 You will see instructions about headset checks. Ignore those references, since headsets are not used or allowed when testing at home.

Interacting with the test proctor

- During the test, the proctor will monitor you (via your webcam and your computer screen) to ensure you follow all testing procedures.
- Make sure you can always be seen on camera by the proctor.
- If you need to contact the proctor during your test, speak to get their attention and/or click the chat icon at the lower right of your Guardian Browser screen to open the chat box. It may take 30–60 seconds for the proctor to reply.
- If the proctor is attempting to chat with you, the chat box will open on your screen.

Troubleshooting FAQs: Preventing technical issues before and during your test

Is there anything I can do ahead of time to prevent issues?

- Bandwidth issues can prevent a successful testing experience. Before starting your test, close or shut down any other devices that may be using significant internet bandwidth.
- Close all browsers and applications not needed for the test. This can help prevent bandwidth issues while you
 test.
- Disable any screen-sharing or remote-access software prior to the test. You'll need to keep it disabled throughout the test and set it so the software won't open automatically during the test.

What if I have an issue right before my test starts?

Your equipment will be checked again right before you test. The test proctor will tell you if there are any issues and you'll have an opportunity to resolve those issues before the test begins.

If I have a technical issue, will my start time be extended?

Your equipment will be checked by the proctor before you begin the test. The timer for your test will not start until after your equipment is checked and you begin the test.

What if I have a technical issue during my test?

If you have a technical issue during your test, speak and wave to get the proctor's attention. If you still have internet access but have been disconnected from the test, notify the proctor via the chat function. You'll see the chat icon on the lower right of your Guardian Browser screen.

What if I lose internet during the test?

If you lose your internet connection momentarily, you'll automatically be reconnected to the proctor when your connection is restored. If your exam can be reopened, your proctor will do so for you.
